Did you know?

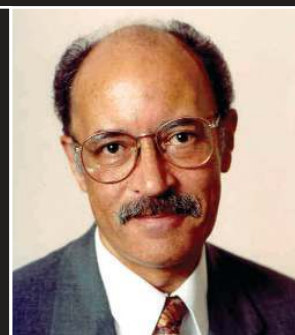
